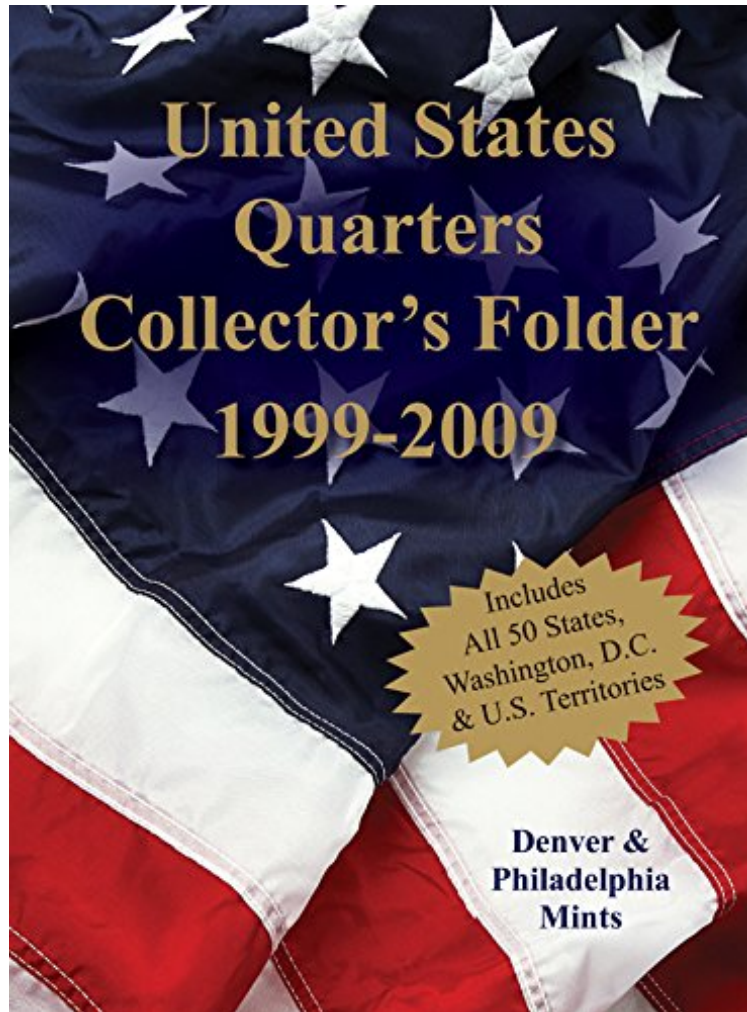

I imagine they would be hard to remove but I found I could press hard from the rear and they would come out. Unfortunately all of these products lack a clear back that lets you see both sides of the coin. Also, better not to use silver polish as many quarters turn black over time since they are not silver...use tooth paste to clean them up. 45 of 47 people found the following review helpful. Quarters do fit, but there are issues. By JineshvPros: Good fit for the Quarters. It has slots for 50 P Quarters, 50 D Quarters and 6 new Quarters specified in the description. Also has EXTRA 6 (or so) Quarter slots. Cons: Once you fit a Quarter in the slot, it is practically impossible to take it out without using some kind of surgeon's tool or tearing the holder apart. In addition, you can see only ONE side of the Quarter once it is in the slot. There's no way to tell if you have a Denver Quarter in the Philadelphia slot (the slots are labeled) or a Philadelphia Quarter in the Denver slot. As mentioned earlier, good luck with taking them out to verify. Hope this helps!

This is a coin collector's dream folder! Not only does it have a space for every state's quarter—arranged according to year—but now it has slots for the six brand-new quarters that the United States Mint is issuing. These latest coins will honor the District of Columbia, along with five U.S. territories: the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.
